A good number of you received violations recently and we are grateful at the quick response and action taken.

There have been **MULTIPLE reported bicycle thefts** in the past 2 weeks, PLEASE lock your bikes up and keep an eye out. Please do not "borrow" someone's bike without permission to get to the other end of the park and then leave it there. This is not nice, not fair and they then think its stolen and call the police. PLEASE be considerate.

A Message from our General Manager

Welcome back to those who have recently arrived back in Briny – A lot of you in the last two weeks. If you have not checked in at the office, PLEASE do so today! If you were not here last season you will need NEW access badges. If you are reading this on paper and are not getting our emails, please get us your updated email ASAP or you are missing valuable information. Apologies in advance, this is a LONG update, it is the first of the season so there is a lot to share.

- There have been many projects this summer, some that will be obvious to you all and many that you will not see but are big improvements to our park and facilities.
- Air conditioners have been replaced in the clubhouse, community center and auditorium.
- The decking at the bathroom entrance to the clubhouse has been repaired, some rotted wood replaced and freshly stained.
- The concrete around the corners and sides of the golf cart gate path have been expanded so we have more surface and less damage to grass. REMEMBER you must use your card on both sides of this gate, it does NOT open automatically from the inside.
- We have made numerous sign replacements. Consistent “logo-branding) combining old and outdated signs as well as replacement of faded signs. This will continue this season as well.
- We have made numerous landscape improvements this past year including added/replaced coconut palms at the clubhouse, replacement palms along Ruthmary and Cordova, removal of very large and dangerous coconut palms and trimming of our ocean banyan trees for hurricane preparation. We also cut back a lot of the old landscape along the Cordova wall, added beautiful new landscape at our main entrance, main flagpole, and marina entrance roadway as well. Hedging has been added in the “gaps” along A1A. 300+ bags of mulch recently placed.
- Decking on the marina was stained to preserve/protect the wood.
- The fencing along the north side of the clubhouse has been scraped down and repainted. A major, visual improvement. This fencing will need to be replaced in the next year or two but it is no longer an eyesore.
- Electrical improvements have been made in multiple buildings including five replacement panels, multiple meter-can upgrades and many safety improvements too, this will continue based on the park wide meter can/electrical survey we commissioned last year.
- We have resealed several roofs including the community center, front half of the office, several areas on Quonset huts and D4 bathhouse.

- Entrance walls, light fixtures, street lettering and several other areas were re-painted recently
- The pool cabana was re-painted at the start of the summer, the sunshades were also replaced. There are several new umbrellas on hand for the pool area as well.
- Damaged concrete steps in front of the community center are being repaired
- The rusted-out chain link fencing across the south end of the butterfly garden was replaced, privacy slats were also added.

I am sure there are other things in and around the park that you will notice that I have not listed. Yes, we have been busy. Andy and his crew have worked tirelessly these last year and I am hopeful the extra efforts are noticeable to you. Have a great weekend.

DISTRICT 4 UPDATES

DISTRICT 4 water is safe for drinking and cooking. If this changes, you WILL be notified. All units in D4 are still connected to the old water lines. At the completion of this project, both new and old water lines will run until our men have time to change over each unit from the old lines to the new lines. This will be done "in-house" as it was not part of the larger contract. If you are in residence you will be notified at the time your unit is being switched over as you will be without water for a short period of time.

DISTRCT 4 CABLE

District 4 residents if you are not in Briny, PLEASE have your caretakers be sure that your cable and/or FPL is working. This may require you to remove the vacation hold a week prior to your return so they can check. If AT&T in not working, call 866-299-8624 so that they can get you fixed. They have had crews in the park daily working on service and repairs in D4.

SURVEY crews from Engenuity are in the park and will be daily thru the end of the year. They are working on the Town commissioned surveys of the park to include topographical data, elevations, roadways, and such and then a utility survey of all the underground utilities, utility box and meter locations etc.

These detailed surveys are the NEXT STEPS to the Flood Adaptation Plan and are resources necessary for the town (and corporation) to work on grants, bids etc. for infrastructure upgrades to seawalls, storm drainage systems and such. The next steps in our future planning.
