NEWS FROM THE PRESIDENT

As noted last week, we did indeed have our first Regular meeting of the year. Many thanks to those who came- it is always nice to look out and see everyone's smiling faces. I know too that some of you watched it on our community station. Thanks to all who made that happen. It certainly was longer than we like but we had correspondence "saved up" from our last meeting in April. A shareholder noted that he thought this took 45 minutes and suggested we provide a summary- but how then do we decide that we summarized it properly? Going forward, this should not be so long. Additionally, after adjourning the first meeting we had a meeting to review and approve some changes and additions to our Rules. With some minor changes, these were approved and should be ready for you in its final form this week. Copies of the proposed changes were distributed at the meeting. Look for changes to Section B. Occupancy/Lots and Looks 2. Pets and a new #3. Service and/or Emotional Support

Animals. An expert lawyer primarily wrote this latter addition from our Association's law firm. Under the same section we modified old #11, new #12 to address Soliciting and/or Signs. This has been a concern for many of you and hopefully we have addressed it. Additionally, a small change to Appendix III (-A) and a new section Appendix III-B was added addressing the inspection of official records of the Corporation. Again, we enlisted our Association lawyer to write the majority of this so we can be sure we are in compliance with Florida Statute 719, the governing document for Cooperatives. We were challenged on some of our changes. We will do due diligence and if necessary, amend but this is truly why we engaged expert legal minds.

We will be holding the annual Budget meeting in December. We will keep you apprised of this. Without sounding too "motherly" may I remind all of us to be respectful of our neighbors, of the use of our facilities and of our Briny ways.
